




WHAT'S NEW?



RECTORS CORNER

Women's 89 Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Let me take you back a few months to November 2024. Women's 89 started on Thursday November 21, 2024, well I guess it really started during Women's 88 when I had the privilege of being the assistant rector for Carol Ann Peterson and Janet O'toole. By the end of that weekend, I was asked to be the rector for Women's 89. At that time, I was in the process of being approved for brain surgery in January and said let me get through that and then I would give my answer. Between the prayers for a successful brain surgery and recovery, I did pray about being a rector. Honestly, I wasn't sure I was ready to be rector. Women's 88 was a challenge for me. My mother was in an assisted living facility and having issues. I was getting phone calls from the facility and ended up having to leave during the closing because she was transferred to the hospital. I left feeling like I was a distraction during the weekend and knew I was not fully focused on the weekend like I should have been. The support and encouragement that I received from the rectors, team and candidates of women's 88 was absolutely amazing. These women gave me just what I needed during that weekend and after. On January 4, 2024 I underwent the first and most difficult of 2 surgeries required for Deep Brain Stimulation for Parkinson's Disease. Knowing the amount of people praying for me from this community and my church took away any anxiety I had. I think it was then that I knew, barring any complications with my recovery, I would say yes to being rector.

Those of you that have served on a team know that the weekend doesn't start at the opening on Thursday night, It starts months before when the rector starts putting a team together. We pray about it, we start making our lists and phone calls and realize quickly during this process that as rector we are just facilitating God's plan for the weekend. He knows who should serve on the weekend and how it will go. He knows the candidates he will send us and the message he wants us to give those candidates. So, as long as we continue to pray for His guidance everything will work out. All this being said, On that Thursday evening we welcomed six new candidates and began the journey that God had planned for the team and candidates. It is a journey for all who attend, yes the team's focus is and should be the candidates, but for me serving on team was even more impactful than being a candidate. The weekend was filled with laughter, tears, and more oranges than the state of Florida! We even had oranges to share with the community during the closing. We felt the love and saw the support from the community all throughout the weekend. The Agape, put together by Eric, Karin and Avery Gard, was beautiful. And the Mananita was just as it always is, a highlight and tear inducing. And in the end we welcomed 6 new amazing Pescadores.

In closing, I would like to thank my sponsor, Karin Gard, for asking me to go on that first weekend as a candidate and encouraging me to serve on that first weekend after. To all who I have served with after who have been part of this journey with me, I am truly blessed and thankful to have served the Lord with you and look forward to having the opportunity to serve on a team with you in the future. And to those that have not had the opportunity to serve on a team, if you are asked, say YES, let the Lord lead you and enjoy the journey.


